DEPARTURE OF PRES. MITRE.

IMPOSING SCENE ON THE BEACH.

The departure of General Mitre for the seat of war having been definitely fixed for vesterday, the beach and adjacent thoroughfare, presented a seene of bustle and animation from an early hour. The neighbors testified their anxiety to do honor to the President and 'hearty good-wishes for his success in the opening campaign, by decorating their houses with flags, and the ships in port were equally demonstrative by hoisting their bunting, Messrs, Mahan, Kean and other foreigners, [notwithstanding the police-fine of \$500] hung out the British and American flags, and Mr. Maxwell had a perfect trophy of foreign ensigns over the Sala de Comercio, while the Captain of the Port had his flagstaff crowded with colors, and catch the enthusiastic infection.

At 11.30 the mole was crowded, and the beach was enlivened by two miliment and soldierlike appearance. In a few moments his Excellency, attendthe Pasco Julio, followed by some fifcheering, as Argentines do not seem to Guards presenting arms, and the people making way for the brilliant cortege of secretaries, staff officers, &c. vast crowd, numbering several thousands, beat with confidence and best wishes for the success and happy return of the President.
