THE MUNICIPALITY.

So accustomed are we all to hear and read of Municipal neglect that it will be a refreshing surprise for the public in general to learn that at last the Municipality is doing something. Since the downfall of the former Board, now six months ago, we have scarcely touched on a single Municipal topic, being anxious to give the new Board a fair trial; and now since it attempts some Municipal reform, it is alike our duty and our interest to point to the matter.

The deplorably neglected state of this city is a matter of public notoriety, and if we seek the means which led to such Municipal degradation, we cannot fail to see that the triumph of misery and neglect is mainly attributable to the very apathy of the citizens themselves, to the energy of deceptive contractors, to the fortitude of Municipal place-hunters, and to an unbounded credit in the utter impunity which surrounded every Municipal act.

As individuals we, of course, have nothing to do with any member of the Municipality, they are men, we suppose who respect and obey the law

but as a corporation we have one

just complaint against the body,

namely, that they are above the law

and amenable to no tribunal for their

acts, the Corporation can sue, but it

seems cannot be sued and since the

board enjoys such a privilege which

we regard as diametrically opposed

to the true spirit of Republicanism,

we think the gentlemen who compose

the Board, cannot be too careful how

they exercise the trust which their

fellow-citizens have reposed in them.

To men of highly tempered moral

principles the great power thus con-

fided would of itself be the best re-

striction to any improper use of it.

The punctilious man of honour, who

finds his public acts obedient to no

control save that of his own con-

science, shrinks from the committal

of any act which is susceptible of the

slightest dubious interpretation, and

we think it is not too much to expect

the same refined sense of honour from

the gentlemen who compose the municipal

Board of Buenos Ayres.

The present municipal Board seems

anxious and willing to do something

for the improvement of the city. It

has entered office surrounded with

difficulties. Ours be not the task to

augment them. The pavement pro-

gresses in the back streets; the un-

couth sidewalks are being levelled;

the vasa boxes are all emptied at

the proper hour, and some very effective

sanitary measures, in the shape

of culverts and sewers, have been con-

structed to remove stagnant filth from

infested pools. To give the municipa-

lity, therefore, its due, we must say

that it has shown some disposition to

improve the city.

Our attention, however, has been

called to two recent measures, which

demand comment. 1st, The cutting

down the branches of the trees in

Palermo; and, 2nd, The vote ordering

the removal of the Protestant Cemetery.

Both measures are, properly speaking,

within the exclusive jurisdiction of the

Municipality; but both, we hold, are

equally unnecessary. The pretext for

the one is as illusory as the motives

which suggested the other. It may be

useful and economic to send a band

of Municipal wood cutters to prune the

trees at the present season, but the

wholesale cutting down of the branches

which is at present going on would

suggest the idea that the Municipality

aimed at rivaling the very trade of

the Baltic. The boughs of the trees

afforded to the citizens a leafy shade

in the heats of summer; they orna-

mented the only patch of public ground

about this city; and no necessity, no

matter how great, can justify the at

tempter wholesale wood-cutting going

on at Palermo.

But the vote of the Municipality to

close the Protestant Cemetery is a mea-

sure so high that it can only be

palliated on the most urgent plea of

public health; we freely admit the

authority and jurisdiction of the municipa-

lity in the matter, but if ever there

was a case of "seeing the mote in

one's neighbour's eye and not the

beam in one's own," it is that of the

Protestant Cemetery. Here we have the

municipality owning a public burial

place, every foot of which is occupied,

the vaults so crowded that they have

been ordered to be walled up, and

grave room so scarce that public

notices in the papers are found necessary

to acquaint the friends of the

departed, that unless the leases are

renewed the graves will be resold, old

graves redug, and coffins pitched up

by the score daily, yet this municipal

cemetary in defiance of the voice of

public opinion, common decency, and

Christian propriety, is kept open, and

on a subject that evokes the deepest

Central Argentine Railroad. Report of a Survey by P. Moneta Esq., To Messrs. Brassey, Wythes and Wheelwright.

Buenos Ayres, Feb. 1, 1867. Gentlemen, I have the honour of placing before you the results of the exploring expedition with which you charged me in the month of April, 1866.

I have the honour of placing before you the results of the exploring expedition with which you charged me in the month of April, 1866. The object of it was to examine the country from Cordova to the Northern Provinces, and to ascertain the shortest, most economical, and most convenient route for laying a railway as far as Salta and Jujuy, passing by Horqueta.

Aconquija, and further on the heights of Salta and Jujuy, I have always found salient points fully sufficient to mark out the course. I have never lost the chance of taking a visual angle that might be of any use, sometimes ascending to the elevated points from which a good view could be obtained, or establishing by triangulation the position of particular points, and, according to the importance of the observations made, the angles have been measured by prismatic compass or a good theodolite.

All these data have been extremely useful, as they have served to correct the course of the railway, inasmuch that it may be considered sufficiently for the object in view. In the course of the expedition, lunar distances were taken whenever a chance offered for doing so, but I have paid more attention to the results obtained by the practice herebefore indicated.

There was a gentle rise in National Securities to-day, attributable to some brokers being compelled to buy to meet commitments; but the extreme tightness of the money market forbids any permanent improvement at present.

On arrival at Salta I was enabled to repair a "Fortin" barometer, which I found there without quicksilver, and the head of the topographical department made observations with it at the regular hours as agreed upon at Cordova.

For the better understanding of this report, I attach a map embracing simply the zone that has been explored.

To form it I commenced by previously determining the position of seven principal points, viz. Cordova, Horqueta, Tucuman, Salta, Jujuy, Pilecia, and Catamarca.

The latitudes of the other places have been determined by meridian altitude of the sun, and in these the difference if any, can only be a few seconds; the longitudes were ascertained by lunar distances, nearly all with the sun.

For the sections of the road comprised between two points, the elevation of which had been determined in the manner above explained, I made use of an Aneroid barometer, which worked with regularity, and enabled me to determine all the undulations of the ground. In the mountainous region this had been done with the greatest care; and where it has been considered particularly interesting to take the difference of level between two places, the observations have been repeated, returning so as to go over it a second time.
